ACT AND STATUTES / MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION (MoA)

1. INTRODUCTION

The **Act and Statutes** or **Memorandum of Association (MoA)** constitute the fundamental legal framework governing the establishment, administration and functioning of Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram. These documents ensure that the institution operates in accordance with statutory requirements and adheres to the norms prescribed for autonomous colleges by the University Grants Commission (UGC).

2. MEANING AND SCOPE

2.1 Act

The *Act* refers to the legal provisions under which the parent organization of the college is established. It provides the statutory basis for the existence and functioning of the institution.

2.2 Statutes and Rules

The *Statutes* and *Rules & Regulations* are framed under the Act and govern the internal administration, academic structure and operational procedures of the institution.

2.3 Memorandum of Association (MoA)

The *Memorandum of Association (MoA)* is the constitutional document of the parent body, defining its objectives, governance structure and operational framework.

3. INSTITUTIONAL LEGAL FRAMEWORK

Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram is managed by **Antyoday Mission, Devgram**, a duly registered organization. The institution operates under the following legal provisions:

- Societies Registration Act, 1860
- Maharashtra Public Trusts Act, 1950

The MoA of the parent body outlines:

- Vision and Mission of the institution
- Educational and social objectives
- Governance and administrative structure
- Roles and responsibilities of the Governing Body

4. GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

The institutional statutes and regulations provide a well-defined framework for governance, including:

6. COLLEGE ACADEMIC AUTONOMY

Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram is presently an affiliated college functioning under its parent university **Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur**. The institution is managed by a registered society **Antyoday Mission, Devgram** and operates as an independent academic entity within the regulatory framework prescribed by the affiliating university.

In the context of autonomy, it is pertinent to note that autonomous colleges continue to remain affiliated to the parent university for the purpose of conferment of degrees. However, they are granted academic independence, including the authority to design curriculum, conduct examinations and declare results as per UGC norms.

Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram is proposed to be granted Autonomous Status from the academic session 2026–2027. Upon conferment of autonomy, the institution will function as an autonomous affiliated college with enhanced academic flexibility and governance. However, the salary of the staff will be governed by the government of Maharashtra .
