WILD PLANTS EXHIBITION



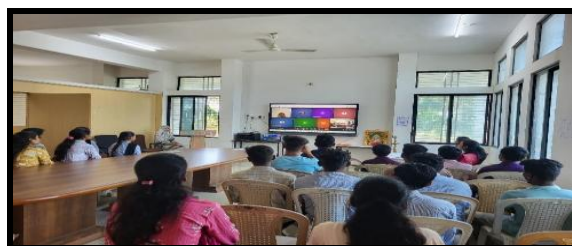

An awareness programme on soil conservation was organized at Devgram by the Environmental Science



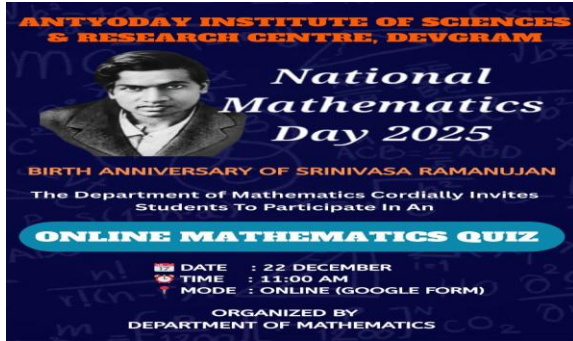
