Ordinances Pertaining to Academics

The academic ordinances of Antyodaya Mahavidyalaya, Devgram (Autonomous) are formulated in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the affiliating university, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University. These ordinances aim to ensure academic excellence, transparency, flexibility, and a student-centric approach in the overall teaching-learning process.

The institution follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) along with a semester pattern for all undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) programs. Each course is assigned a defined number of credits, and students are required to successfully complete the prescribed credits for the award of a degree. The curriculum is designed to be dynamic and relevant, and it is periodically reviewed and updated by the Board of Studies (BoS) and approved by the Academic Council to align with emerging academic trends, industry needs, and national education policies.

Admissions are granted strictly on the basis of merit, eligibility criteria, and reservation policies as prescribed by the competent authorities. The medium of instruction and examination is generally English and/or Marathi, depending on the nature of the program and subject requirements.

A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory for all students to be eligible to appear for the End Semester Examination (ESE). Students who fail to meet the attendance requirement may be detained from appearing in examinations unless valid reasons are approved by the competent authority. The institution maintains strict discipline in academic activities, and students are expected to actively participate in lectures, tutorials, practical's, and co-curricular engagements.

The evaluation system is comprehensive and includes Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and End Semester Examination (ESE). Internal assessment components include

assignments, unit tests, quizzes, seminars, presentations, project work, and practical examinations. This continuous evaluation helps in monitoring students' academic progress and encourages consistent performance.

The college also provides academic support systems such as mentoring, remedial coaching for slow learners, and advanced learning opportunities for meritorious students. Skill enhancement courses, add-on programs, and value-based education initiatives are integrated into the academic framework to promote holistic development.

In addition, the institution ensures the use of modern teaching methodologies, including ICT-enabled learning, e-resources, and interactive classroom practices. Academic audits and feedback mechanisms are regularly conducted to maintain quality standards and improve institutional performance.

Overall, these academic ordinances establish a robust, flexible, and quality-driven education system that fosters intellectual growth, ethical values, and professional competence among students at Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram.

Ordinances Pertaining to Examination

The examination ordinances of Antyoday Mahavidyalaya, Devgram (Autonomous) are framed in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the affiliating university, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University. These ordinances aim to ensure a fair, transparent, and comprehensive evaluation system that upholds academic integrity and credibility.

The college follows a semester-based examination system under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The evaluation process consists of two components: Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and End Semester Examination (ESE). The internal assessment typically carries a weightage of 20–40% and includes unit tests, assignments, seminars, presentations, practicals, and attendance. The End Semester

Examination, conducted by the college, carries the remaining weightage and is held at the end of each semester as per the academic calendar.

Question papers are set by qualified subject experts, ensuring confidentiality and adherence to the prescribed syllabus and learning outcomes. The examination process is conducted under strict supervision to prevent malpractice. Any use of unfair means is dealt with as per the rules and may lead to cancellation of the examination or further disciplinary action.


Answer scripts are evaluated through a centralized and confidential mechanism to maintain objectivity and accuracy. The results are declared within a stipulated time and are presented in terms of grades, Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA), and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

The college provides provisions for revaluation, rechecking, and obtaining photocopies of answer scripts within a prescribed time frame. A grievance redressal mechanism is established to address student concerns related to examinations and results.

Students who fail or remain absent in examinations are allowed to appear for supplementary or backlog examinations as per rules. The ordinances also define the maximum duration for completion of a program.

Although the college conducts examinations autonomously, the final degree is awarded by the affiliating university upon successful completion of the program and submission of results.

These examination ordinances ensure a robust, transparent, and student-friendly evaluation system that promotes academic excellence and accountability.
